# Online Assessment Tool For Next Year's Sixth Graders

On the district website on the right hand side under March Links, there is a link that says:

Math options for next year's 6th graders. Is Math Path II right for you?

When you click on that link, it takes you to a page that has a link to the letter that was sent home as well as a link to information about Math Path II and **Directions for the Assessment.** It is important that families read the directions before they complete the assessment so that they receive the results.

# FLASH & HIV/AIDS Curriculum Information Sessions for Grade 5 –

Briarwood, Cascade Ridge, Clark, Cougar Ridge, Endeavour, Grand Ridge, Issaguah Valley, and Maple Hills

Your child's teacher will be teaching the district adopted FLASH (Family Life and Sexual Health) and HIV/AIDS curriculum during this school year. To allow you an opportunity to examine the instructional materials and view the videos that may be used, there will be two public viewings of the materials at Issaguah Valley Elementary Multi-Purpose Room on the following dates:

Thursday, April 21, 2011 6:00 pm Saturday, April 23, 2011

9:00 am

At the appointed time there will an informal presentation with viewing of video(s). Curriculum staff and a teacher will be available to answer your questions.

#### FLASH Instruction:

Under the Federal Hatch Amendment of 1974, all sexual education instructional materials must be available for parent inspection. Parents have the right to exempt their child from sexual education instruction at any time. The public viewings provide a centralized opportunity to do so.

#### **HIV/AIDS Instruction:**

In recognition of the significant threat that the HIV/AIDS virus presents to the health of the people of our nation, the Washington state legislature passed the Omnibus AIDS Bill in 1988. This law directs local school districts to provide yearly instruction to students in grades 5-12 about the pathology and prevention of the HIV/AIDS virus. This is the twenty-second year of such instruction.

It is not necessary for parents to attend a public review session if they do not intent to exempt their children from HIV/AIDS instruction. The Washington State Omnibus AIDS law requires a parent to attend a public viewing session and review the materials before such an exemption may be requested or granted. Being familiar with the curriculum will enhance your ability to talk with your children about this serious health threat.

#### Summer school registration is now open for elementary school students.

Elementary Summer School is for current first through fifth graders who would like to get a jump-start on next year's learning. The program also provides remedial assistance over the summer. Classes are held on weekdays from July 5 to July 29, 9AM to 12 PM, at Clark Elementary School. Tuition is \$375 and applications are available in your school office or on the **District website**.

Summer Computer Camp is for current fourth and fifth graders. Students will learn how to use a camera, how to film correctly, and how to transfer video into the computer. They will learn the fundamentals of video production and editing and how to use still pictures and video to make a movie. Their final project will be to produce a DVD. Summer Computer Camp runs weekdays from July 11 to July 22, 9:30 to 11:30, at Clark Elementary School. Tuition for this two-week program is \$225 and applications are available in your school office or on the District website.
