Messages to your student:

If you need to get a message to your child about a change in end-of-day plans, please call the office,not the classroom. The office makes those calls into the classroom at the end of the day to limit classroom disruptions. Please help us by limiting these messages to emergency changes only!

Personal Toys or Items:

Cascade Ridge has made a change that was not yet included in "Our Rules";

VOICE Mentor Program

I would love to share a volunteer opportunity that is available here at Cascade Ridge if you have an hour a week to share with us throughout the school year. The VOICE Mentor Program, which is funded by the Issaquah Schools Foundation, is a program that matches community volunteers to work one on one with Issaquah students. These students are referred by teachers and counselors as needing extra support, whether it is academic, social or emotional. The Volunteers work in the school setting in partnership with the school staff. While you cannot volunteer within your own child's classroom, you can volunteer to work here at our school and work with a few students who could benefit from your time and interest. Currently we only have two VOICE mentors for our entire school. There are many of our students who are currently not being served, who could benefit from working with a VOICE mentor whether it is in reading, writing or math.

The VOICE mentoring program has been positively received here at our school as students have really appreciated having someone take the time to help them with a writing assignment or listen to them read. Likewise parents and community volunteers have enjoyed getting to know a handful of students and working with them consistently throughout the year.

ISSAQUAH Issaquah Schools Foundation Supports Cascade Ridge Elementary School

FOUNDATION As we start the new year, I want to help 'spread the word' about a partner that helps make possible so much of what makes our schools special—the Issaquah Schools Foundation.

The Foundation is a community-supported non-profit that works year-round to raise funds to bridge the gap between the dollars the state provides for basic education and the money our schools require to give students the comprehensive 21st Century education they need for success. With parent and community support, the Foundation is able to fund programs and investments that advance academic achievement, support struggling students, and promote professional development.

From 2009 to 2011, Foundation funded investments at Cascade Ridge include:

- A NEW K-5 Science Curriculum adoption to ensure our students meet state requirements and experience the wonder of science from their first day in school. Working together with the PTSA's, \$438,000 was raised to ensure every grade level would have an engaging, comprehensive curriculum that was aligned with state standards.
- Portable Technology to Support Elementary Diverse Learners iPads and APPS will be used to increase diverse learner's communication, academic and social skills (2010-2011 / \$7,988)
- **District Wide Visual Arts Lessons K-5** Lesson plans for grades K-5, integrated with ISD Curriculum and aligned to WA State "Arts Framework" for Teachers and Art Docents. (2010-2011 / \$7,500)
- **Learning Music Through Technology** Music software that provides an engaging way to teach and reinforce a variety of music skills and concepts and help differentiate instruction. (2008-2009 / \$1,250)
- National Board Certification Scholarships that give teachers access to the 'pinnacle' of professional development programs; equipping them with the tools to develop inquisitive, engaged learners. Cascade Ridge currently has two National Board Certified teachers.
- VOICE (Volunteers of Issaquah Changing Education) a mentor/tutor program that pairs caring community volunteers with struggling students to improve academic performance, boost self-esteem, and help curb the high-school dropout rate. At Cascade Ridge, seven students are being served by three mentors.

- **GLAD** a 'best practices' professional development program that helps teachers reach students of every learning style and help them excel. **Cascade Ridge has 19 GLAD trained teachers!**
- **Nurse's Fund** Funds for all schools to provide necessary essentials for student learning such as eyeglasses, prescriptions, breakfast foods, etc. \$5,000/yr

The Foundation needs your help to continue providing these programs—and more, to our students. Please consider donating to their *All in for Kids* Annual Fund campaign this fall. Your gift, whether \$5 a month or \$500 will make a tremendous difference in the quality of educational resources Cascade Ridge can make available to your student.
