### PTSA PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It is with great gratitude that I find myself writing my final "President Letter." It has been a wonderful and fulfilling two years for me in this role, and I'm very grateful to have had this opportunity. As I think back over the two years, I am, yet again, reminded of what an amazing community we have in our staff, parents, and students at Cascade Ridge. It is a community that truly cares for our kids that is at the very core of everything we do. Without such a deep level of caring and commitment, we could not accomplish all that we have every year since Cascade Ridge first opened in 2001.

For this year, our PTSA has filled the year with many amazing accomplishments and impacts for our school and children, and we have much for which we can be proud. This year, some of our accomplishments included:

**Continued direct support to vital student needs through financial and volunteer support** - About *\$70K in total* (90% of our total budget) was budgeted for the following: **\$17K to Staff Grants**, **\$9K to Arts & Science Enrichment**, **\$7K to Reading Support**, **\$12K to K-4 Drama and 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Enhancement Programs**, **\$4K to Art & Science Docent**, **Science Fair**, **and Fine Arts Night**, **\$5K to various education and safety support programs** (i.e. Eager Reader, Reflections, Math Club, Safety Patrol, Parent and Child Education, Foreign Language, Spelling & Geography Bees, Field Day), **\$6K for Community Events** (i.e. Caring through Sharing, Dad's Day, Great Kids, Birthday Celebrations, Festival of Cultures, Winterfest, 5<sup>th</sup> Grade End-of-Year Celebrations, Staff Appreciation),

**Implementing our first ever online Membership sign-up** - This included bringing as much as possible from our previous and voluminous "First Day Packet" online. It minimized the amount of paperwork our kids brought home during those first few days of school and provided the opportunity for everyone to do many things online instead of through tiresome paperwork: sign up for PTSA membership, review and sign-up for volunteer opportunities, complete preferences for receiving information throughout the year, order Coyote Wear online, and to pay for it all at one time and with one form of payment. Each year, this process will become easier and efficient for us all,

**PTSA Website revamp and revitalization** – Need we say more? Just check it out and you'll see how packed the site is with usable and easy-to-find information! <u>www.cascaderidgeptsa.org</u>,

**Increased online signup for ongoing events** including the Walkathon, Winterfest, Fine Arts Night, the Spelling Bee, Science Fair and others. We received wonderful feedback throughout the year regarding these changes, and we will continue to strive to make things easier for everyone,

**Successful Fundraising that met and beat our goals** which enabled us to fulfill all of our budgeted expenses in support of our kids for the year,

**Appropriate (based on General Membership vote and approval) Spending of Excess/Accumulated Funds**: \$16+K for our school to develop a Guided Reading Room similar to those that several other elementary schools in the district have developed, \$12K for a Reader Board, something that our school has

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needed for years to provide quick and timely communications to the whole community, and \$10K to the very important "Got Science?" initiative which will help ensure our district has appropriate funding to implement the new Science Curriculum at our elementary schools,

**Implementation of new and desired programs at the school**: Foreign Language, Spelling Bee, Geography Bee, Great Kids,

**Continued Parent Education Offerings** that provide parents with current and important information for raising our kids and ever-changing societal pressures and challenges,

**Purchase of important equipment for the school**: \$4K spent for new radios for safety use, during typical days and during emergencies and ~25 new digital cameras for use at all grade levels in developing new ways to teach our kids in this highly technically-advanced world.

Wow!! How lucky are our kids to have so many amazing opportunities, particularly during these economic times where state and district budgets are suffering? Our district has been hit very hard these past few years, and more than ever, it is important for families to recognize the value of giving, both financially and through volunteer efforts, to continue to provide these opportunities to our children. We are very fortunate to have a wonderful public school system, and we need to continue to support that system. PTSA is a vitally important component and means for providing that communal support.

Of course, these accomplishments are due to the continued and passionate involvement of the many dedicated families and staff of our school and I continue to value and appreciate everyone who contributes in so many ways to our success. Each and every one of you who has contributed in ANY way is appreciated. A special thank you goes out to everyone who chaired events or programs and those who served on the Board. I will be moving out of the President role and am confidently handing the reins to Deanne King, who I know will be an amazing President. Thank you to everyone who is already thinking ahead as to where you can contribute and be a part of our upcoming successes. There will be more opportunities to sign up as we start the next year, and the online volunteer signups are always open as well!!

Here's to a great and restful summer for all. We then look forward to seeing everyone in the Fall. Don't forget that school will start BEFORE Labor Day on Tuesday, August 30th. PTSA SURVEY RESULTS



Many thanks to everyone who took the time to complete our community PTSA survey. We had 89 responses (amazingly, that's *exactly* the same number as last year!) and we truly appreciate the feedback we received as a result of your comments. In general, we had very similar feedback this year as we did last year in the survey. Could that be that the same people filled out the survey as last year?! Perhaps... Regardless, knowing what our community needs and desires are core to our planning, we used the survey results to prioritize plans for next year and we incorporated many of your suggestions into our planning and budgeting for next year. Some of the feedback you provided included the following:

**COMMUNICATIONS**: In general, those who responded to the survey felt well informed about PTSA events and activities. 98% responded "yes" to feeling adequately informed. In addition, the most effective forms of communication are class newsletters/emails, The Howler, Coyote Connection, classroom representatives, and our PTSA website (in that order). This is great news for us because over the years, we have consciously moved away from paper communications in favor of electronic means of providing information, and we know it has taken time to implement this change. In addition, we were thrilled that our website made it to the "Top Five" because we have spent countless hours and effort into revitalizing and renewing the website to make it a primary means of providing current and timely information. This will continue to be a focus in the coming years. There is also ongoing work every month to provide relevant and timely information through our Howler and the Coyote Connection, and we hope this information continues to be important to the community. We do all we can to push current information and to utilize our website, enews, and classroom representatives to keep all information current and available to the community. I invite everyone to continue to spread the word and encourage your friends to utilize the website and to read the weekly Connection and monthly Howler emails.

**PRIORITIES**: In our survey, we asked you to rank the various Curriculum and Community Programs that we have funded throughout the year. Having this information is key for us in planning for the coming year, and according to your answers, priorities continue to be similar to previous years. We will continue to fund the Arts & Science Grants, Reading Support, and Staff General Grants, K-4 Drama, & 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum, among others. We will also continue to focus on Student and Community programs such as the Science Fair, Eager Reader, Safety Patrol, and Great Kids, to name just a few. We were excited to hear that Great Kids has quickly become a popular program and we have our new principal, Mrs. Fowler, to thank for bringing this great program to our school! We also found that our community recognizes the value of supporting and appreciating our staff, and we will continue to encourage and support that.

Other popular and new/improved programs that we will continue to support through our and volunteers include the Math Club, Spelling Bee, and Geography Bee, and we will make some significant changes to what was previously the K-Kids program. Next year it will be called "Caring Coyotes" and will be primarily run by a few teachers and will continue to be supported through parent volunteers. Be sure to look for more information on this when school gets started again.

FUNDRAISING: We asked about participation in our various fundraising activities. Again this year, and based on community feedback, we continued in the path requested in previous years that we focus our fundraising efforts to a single primary fundraiser. We also combined our Walkathon with a community event to bring everyone together and meet our fundraising and some socializing needs early in the year. Our survey told us that 92% of the community participated in this. In addition, 86% responded that this combination of the fundraiser and the community event is your first choice. With these responses, we plan to continue in this direction for fundraising in the coming year. We will also continue to offer the other "passive" fundraising opportunities that continue to be popular such as the Book Fair, Coyote Wear, Car Wash tickets, our "Mixedbags", and of course, we will continue to rely on other passive fundraising opportunities including Labels for Education and corporate Matching Funds to gain additional funding.

**KEEP DOING WHAT WORKS**: We were happy to get some very positive feedback regarding generally doing the right amount of things at the right scale. We are such a lucky group at Cascade Ridge in that we have an amazing staff and community that are very involved, dedicated, and committed to supporting our students to be all they can be, and obviously all that we do is a broad community effort. We plan to keep offering the quality programs that you have come to expect, and based on your feedback we will continue to focus on the areas that are viewed as important.

We also surveyed our school staff to get their valuable feedback. We heard back from 21 staff members and we received good information regarding the value of the support and programs that the PTSA provides for them as well. The results told us that we are providing positive support to the needs of the teachers and the students and we know what areas we need to continue to focus to provide the best possible support to our kids during their time at Cascade Ridge.

The GM approved the recommendation and as a result, we will send a grant for \$10,000 to "Got Science?". We should all be proud for supporting this important cause for our students.

Once the meeting was adjourned, we had a special Parent Education program about Adolescent Stress and Depression, which is an important topic for all parents to gain understanding in today's society. Thanks again to everyone who was able to stay to gain insight through this presentation.

Our first General Membership for next school year will be in mid-September and we hope to see a great crowd then! Happy summer, everyone!

### MATH CLUB UPDATE

We had a wonderful year with Math Club. On Saturday, May 7, we had 33 of the 48 kids participate in two different state wide competitions: Math Championship in Blaine and WSMC Olympiad in Seattle.

Two teams of 6 kids in total challenged themselves to participate in the tougher Middle School Math Championship in Blaine. Scoring for this championship is highly competitive as they are ranked against each other. Our two teams from CRE performed successfully and we are so proud of them for making that extra effort in preparation for this particular competition.

Seven teams with a total of 27 kids participated in the Washington State Math Council's Middle School Math Olympiad in Seattle. Every single team (including the 4<sup>th</sup> graders) exceeded the standard against which they are judged thereby earning at least one ribbon of excellence. Some teams earned two ribbons and two teams earned two medals each (the highest award). One of our teams had the top score in session 2 amongst all the 21 teams at this site. They were also the only team in this site to receive a "superior" rating as they scored all 5 correct answers in "Number Sense".

We are so proud of all our bright, young mathematicians whether or not they participated in the championships. We wish them the very best in all their future endeavors.

A big thank you to the Coaches Jai Chakrapani, Rajeev Goel, Raghu Allepally and Sheela Pai for all their time and effort the whole season. We are also grateful for the effort put in by Malini Ajwani who was able to coach for part of the year. And finally, a huge thank you to Ranjani Chakrapani who chaired this wonderful program, took care of all the logistics throughout the year, and was responsible for expanding it to the level it is at today.




