First Mrs. Fowler initiated our "Coffee with the Principal" portion of the meeting with an open forum. We then started a very busy meeting that included the following:

- ♦ We reviewed our financial information and noted that the organization continues to be on track for budget expectations and for providing great programs for the school.
- We elected Pamela Franklin as our VP Community Relations for the balance of the year.
- We elected our Nominating Committee that is responsible for developing a slate of nominees for our 2012 – 2013 PTSA Board. This is a big responsibility and we appreciate the dedication and hard work of Jaycee Cooper, Laura Fortner, Pam Gross, Mary Jo Webb, and Tina Yerges. Thank you!
- We heard a presentation from Jake Kuper from the Issaquah School District and Alison Meryweather from Volunteers of Issaquah Schools (VIS) regarding the April 17 bond package. At the end of the discussion, we voted for the Cascade Ridge PTSA to both publicly endorse the bond and to give an additional \$5,000 to VIS to support its passage.
- Finally, we also voted to give \$2,700 to the school to negotiate the purchase of a lifetime subscription package for our new die cut machine.

It was a crazy busy, productive, and informative meeting, and we had an interested and engaged group. Many thanks to everyone who spent the time with us to be an important part of the process. As you probably already realize, we continue to be a very busy organization and things don't seem to slow down; this is an indication of the important causes our membership supports throughout the whole year on behalf of all of our students. The Cascade Ridge School Site Council is comprised of a broad group of people that includes community/parent, school, and PTSA representatives? It's true!! Many people don't understand the purpose of the Site Council, and the best thing about it is that it has this broad, so issues that are important to us all can be addressed. One of our current items of focus for the Site Council during this year is updating "Our Rules" handbook. We are creating a handbook that will answer your questions and provide you valuable information all in one place.

The Site Council's purpose includes the following:

- · Provide input to help create and maintain an optimal learning environment,
- · Blend the values and perspectives of community, parents, staff, and students for effective school-wide results,
- · Foster effective communication on key issues among all stakeholders in our school,
- Contribute to creative school-wide planning and problem solving,

PTSA ENDORSES ISD 2012 BOND

Our PTSA voted to endorse the ISD 2012 bond at our general meeting on January 26th. Thanks to all who attended and voted!

Among other things, this bond will rebuild our oldest schools. After more than five decades, Clark Elementary, Issaquah Middle, and Sunny Hills Elementary are at the end of their life spans. Long-term financial forecasts favor rebuilding now—in a period of historic low construction costs—rather than making ongoing major repairs in the years ahead. Additionally, new buildings tend to run about 30% more efficiently, saving utility dollars for classroom operations.



We've gotten feedback in the past that different parents in our community have different preferences in terms of how much email they wish to receive from the PTSA. So, in an effort to make everybody happy, we have a few different options for you to choose from. To manage your own email preferences, visit the "my account" section of the website (https://cascaderidge.ourschoolpages.com/Account/Summary), and click the Edit pencil next to your name. Under "Email preferences", you will see the following choices:

Coyote Howler: This is our monthly newsletter which contains tons of great information about upcoming programs. If you are not receiving the Howler in your Inbox at the beginning of every month, make sure to check this box!

Reminders: We only send out email reminders for those important events and deadlines that we think you all care about. We try not to ever send out more than one of these reminder emails per week, because nobody likes to be spammed. But receiving these emails is a good way to make sure you don't accidentally miss out on anything important.

Legislative news: We haven't ever sent these types of emails out yet, but as the School District Bond vote gets closer, we will be passing along some useful information through email, but only for those that wish to receive it.

Just check the boxes next to the emails you wish to receive, and press **Save**! You can also change your spouse's email preferences if you like! (Hee, hee!)

Note that the school's weekly newsletter, the Coyote Connection, is not included in these settings, because those emails are not sent by the PTSA ... those are sent from the district's ENews system and email list, which are managed separately.
