Hello Cascade Ridge Families! It is time again for all CRE families to show our gratitude for all we have by helping those in need. Like last year, this year Caring Thru Sharing (CTS) will support the Issaquah Food Bank, a local organization that provides gifts and goods for families in our area who could use a helping hand this holiday season.

Because the need is great, the Issaquah Food Bank is no longer handing out gift tags, as they did in years past. Instead, each classroom has been given a theme (such as "hats, mittens and scarves") and students who choose to participate are encouraged to bring in <u>NEW</u> items supporting the theme. Caring Thru Sharing classroom representatives have already kicked off the program and announced the theme for your student's classroom. All students also have the option to bring in either gift cards (Safeway, Target, Fred Meyer, or QFC, in any dollar amount) or gift wrapping supplies (wrapping paper, tissue, gift tags, tape, ribbon, bows).

Gift collection will happen during the week of Monday, December 3rd – Friday, December 7th. Please bring your items to your classroom and leave them in the designated Caring Thru Sharing boxes as directed by your classroom rep. Please note that this year items should **NOT** be gift wrapped. This is a change from last year.



At the Regional Competition, the Lego Mindstorm robots that the teams have built will perform challenges against other local teams' robots. The teams will also perform presentations based upon this year's theme, Senior Solutions, aimed at solving a problem faced by seniors as they age. Linda Warner's team, the "Robot Gladiators", came up with a motorized scissor lift to help seniors lift objects and reach high places. Stephen Rozmiarek's team, the "NXT Nerds", came up with an innovation to embed a directional or shotgun mic inside a pair of glasses. The idea is to help seniors who need hearing aids hear better in crowded places, like restaurants. Both teams interviewed seniors and had senior partners help them with their projects.



Bill's primary agenda is to find out what our individual concerns and fears are within our own families, and then work towards finding answers. If you come to a meeting, your concerns will be addressed! Each meeting will be adapted to take on the particular needs of those attending that particular meeting---in other words, Bill is offering a **personalized** workshop for parents every month! It is open to anyone who wants to join us...and it's **free!!**

And to make our meetings more accessible to everyone, we are offering both a daytime and an evening option each month. We realize that everyone's schedules are busy and that one time doesn't "fit all", so we are trying to accommodate as many people as possible by offering two alternatives each month.

Of course, if you have a specific topic of interest, like those we have addressed in the past (substance use/abuse, mood disorders, self-harm, eating disorders, internet fears, etc.), bring your questions with you---we will make sure your questions are heard and answered to the best of our ability. And if we cannot answer them, we will offer you resources that can point you in the right direction!

That is what our Parent Networking Group is all about---helping parents find and implement solutions and strategies for equipping their kids to become successful and responsible adults in a sometimes scary and challenging world that is vastly different from the one we grew up in... We are about creating whole and healthy kids and families, so please join us!
