PTSA WEBSITE NEWS - ONLINE DIRECTORY IS LIVE!

Did you know that we added a new online directory to our cascaderidgeptsa.org website last spring? While our printed PTSA directories will not be available until later this Fall, you can take advantage of our online directory now to contact new school friends and neighbors!

After logging into your cascaderidgeptsa.org website account, simply click on the "Online Directory" link on the left navigation bar and you can search by name for parents and/or students at Cascade Ridge. Note that this feature is only available to authorized website users who have an account at cascaderidgeptsa.org.

By default, if you are included in the school's printed directory, then all of the information you have previously submitted to the PTSA website will be available to online directory users. This information includes your name, address, phone number(s) and email address as well as the names of any children at Cascade Ridge, their grade and their teacher's name. You can choose to hide information about yourself by looking up your own name in the directory, and then clicking on the button next to the field that you want to hide. Once hidden, this information will not be visible to other users when they perform a search.

Reflections

Start creating! 'Reflections' is a national, cultural arts competition where students create their own original works in one of the following categories: literature, music composition, photography, visual arts, film/video, dance/choreography. The theme for 2014-15 is 'the world would be a better place if...'

Deadline for submissions is early November.

Eager Reader

Eager Reader is a voluntary reading incentive program, designed to foster a love of reading. Students read outside of school to earn prizes. Each minute spent reading counts to toward both individual and class totals en route to fun prizes – including gift cards at participating merchants, books and a kindle!

Eager Reader starts October 10 and continues for four weeks.

Art Docent

Led by parent volunteers in each classroom, the Art Docent program teaches students about famous works of art, artistic concepts and techniques through the completion of hands-on monthly projects.

Math Club

Numbers your thing? 4th and 5th graders interested in honing their math skills are invited to join the Cascade Ridge Math Club. Our talented mathematicians meet Monday or Wednesday mornings before school en route to a regional Math Olympiad in the spring, where our Coyotes are pitted against students from other schools.

Caring Through Sharing

Caring Through Sharing supports our community by offering a collection point for gifts and groceries during the holiday season. Each classroom needs a parent-volunteer coordinator and is assigned a category (for example – pajamas or art supplies) and families are asked to participate by donating items.

The event starts on December 9 and culminates in a caravan delivery to the Issaquah Food Bank in early December.

Caring Coyotes

Caring Coyotes is a year-long program designed to reinforce the importance of community involvement and the spirit giving. Once each month the club meets after school to perform various community service projects. Students decide what local community initiatives to support – usually 3-5 outreach events per year.

Science Fair

How can you tell if an egg is raw or hard boiled by looking at it? What is oobleck? How does soil impact the growth of plants? These questions and more may be answered this year at the 13th Ridge Science Fair! The much anticipated event lets students explore a topic of their choice. Students work on their project over several weeks and proudly display their work. Join all our budding scientists on March 26, 6-8 pm for a spectacular scientific show!

Geography Bee

Where in the world is Timbuktu? What is the capital of Brazil? What is the largest city in China? All these questions and more will be answered in a fun test of geography facts and figures. Please join us on January 27-28... great prep for our Festival of Cultures on January 29th

While most of our programs are led by volunteers and therefore free to any/all students, some programs are offered in a classroom atmosphere either before or after school and are offered by outside vendor/professionals. While we are still confirming logistics, the following classes are slated for the 2013-14 school year:
