
Next year our meetings will take place from 4-5pm on the following dates:

Issaquah Food Bank

Issaquah Food Bank in search of neighborhood coordinators!

Our Trossachs neighborhood is part of an exciting pilot initiative with the Issaquah Food and Clothing Bank called The Food Project. Modeling similar programs in our region, we aim to find neighborhood coordinators who can invite friends and neighbors to contribute just 1 bag of donated food every 2 months. As a coordinator, you will pickup the bags from your donors and simply deliver the full bags on select dates (noted below).

It's easy! Here how it works:

- 1. Donors are provided with a reusable shopping bag
- 2. Donors fill it with as much non-perishable food as they want
- 3. Every 2 months (on designated dates), donors leave the bag on their porch
- 4. Neighborhood coordinators will pick up the bag and leave a new bag for next time.
- 5. Neighborhood coordinators deliver all collected bags to the Shepard of the Hills Church parking lot

The remaining pickup dates this year will be August 10th, October 12th and December 14th.

The goal of this program is to provide a consistent and reliable source of food donations to the Issaquah Food Bank. This is a simple and fun way to involve our children, friends and neighbors in helping our community; it never

takes more than a couple of hours each month. Our Food Bank served 2,876 unique individuals last year and many more in our community are slipping through the cracks and are in need of basic resources.
